Ours being an affiliated college (affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala) has no freedom to develop its own curriculum. Therefore, the curriculum developed by Punjabi University, Patiala is implemented.

Our faculty members who are members of various Boards of Study/Faculty of different Departments of the University participate in the meetings held by these Boards/Faculties on all academic matters associated with the development, implementation and operation of academic programmes followed by Departmental meetings at the college level.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Time to time curriculum revision and updating on the basis of feedback by the stakeholders

6.3.4 Research and Development

- We have a research committee who organises meetings atleast once in a semester in which various plans to promote research are discussed and faculty members are motivated for academic advancement. Faculty members are also updated regarding various fellowship schemes provided by UGC and help in applying for the same is ensured.
- The faculty of the affiliated colleges who have five years of experience of teaching PG classes can act as guide for Ph.D students.
- The college administration actively supports research and development by encouraging the faculty to participate/present papers in seminars/conferences/workshops etc. The college also promotes the various departments to organise such events.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The college has a fully automated library having a number of journals, e-journals and reference books besides a large number of text books. It is open from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm on all the working days.
- A workshop on the use of e-resources was organized for the faculty by the library in-charge in collaboration with Mrs. Rekha Rani Assistant Prof. in Computer Science from 2nd and 3rd of Aug., 2017.
- A workshop on the use of e-resources was organized for all PG students by the library in-charge in collaboration with Mrs. Rekha Rani Assistant Prof. in Computer Science from 21st to 23rd Aug., 2017.
- The Institute facilitates extensive use of ICT resources including development and use of computer aided teaching/learning/material by its staff and students.
- The whole campus is Wi-fi enabled and all the laboratories are well equipped.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Human Resource Management being a very sensitive area, the college therefore, adheres to the principle of rigorous discipline but with warm human touch. The administration has its own mechanism to keep a close watch on each and every employee in comfortable limits so that he/she could work efficiently to the maximum of his/her capacity. Following measures were adopted during the session 2016-17 :

- Participative managements exists as the institution understands that substantial value can be created by sharing ideas among employees and the same is practiced through :
 - Committee approach to management
 - The college has various committee/cells comprising of convener and faculty members team which monitors and manages different academic and non-academic responsibilities.
- Decisions are taken on the basis of feedback from informal interaction from all stakeholders.
- Faculty members are motivated to acquire additional qualification.
- Faculty members attend Refresher/Orientation programmes
- Faculty members are encouraged to present and publish papers in International/National forums.
- Faculty members serve as Experts/Resource persons/Chair the sessions in National Seminars/Workshops organized by others institutions and organizations.
- Faculty members also extend Consultancy Services.
- Under IQAC all quality improvement/developmental tasks are systematically planned.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The posts are advertised in reputed national and regional newspapers. The applications are invited from eligible candidates satisfying UGC/Punjabi University norms. The selection of staff is based on merit and as per UGC/Punjabi University norms.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- The students of a few departments visit industry as per the requirement of the curriculum/or acquaint the students with the latest advancements taking place in the industry. The industry is an important stakeholder for any institution of higher learning as the graduates are absorbed by it. It is therefore important that there is a system of feedback from the industry (employers) and the professional bodies to prepare students for a successful career and enhance their employability. This is done through an interaction with the industry by way of industrial visits/visits of different industries in the job fest organised by one of our sister concern (SSDWIT) in the campus and invitation to the representatives from the industry/professional bodies etc.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Admission of students to B.Com (Reg.&Hons.) BCA, B.Sc (CSM), BSc(Med. & Non Med.), B.Lib, MA (Hindi, Punjabi & English), M.Sc (Mathametics), M.Com, M.Sc (IT) Regular & LE is done on first come first serve basis keeping in mind the intake strength as mentioned in the prospectus following the eligibility criteria laid down by the university. Admission to B.A is open to the student who satisfies minimum eligibility conditions as laid down by the university.

During the session 2017-18, 1123 students were admitted to various courses available in the college.

6.4 Welfare schemes for Faculty, Staff and Students.

As the college thrives on the staff friendly environment various welfare schemes have been implemented for the satisfaction of faculty, staff and students.

- The college has adopted the CPF scheme whereby the management contributes its share equal to the share of employees every month.
- Advances/Loan facilities to carry out family responsibilities like arrangement for weddings, purchase of house/vehicle etc. are provided through a very easy mechanism.
- Funds are collected to facilitate any individual member of the staff in his/her emergency.
- ESI scheme is also made available to the employees (teaching and non-teaching) having monthly salary of 15,000 /- or less than this in which the major share is contributed by the management. All eligible employees have been covered under this scheme.
- Fee concession to the children of teaching and non-teaching staff and free education to the children of support staff is provided.
- Summer and winter uniform to all the support staff and gift in cash for Diwali celebration is also given to the support staff.
- Fee concession to the students belonging to low income group and discount on fee on the basis of merit is provided to the students.
- There is a provision of paying fee in easy instalments.
- In addition to Group Insurance for students health facility during the stay in the college is provided.
- Book bank facility is also available for the students belonging to weaker sections of the society.
- Extra coaching is provided for slow and advance learners within the college time which is free of cost.
- Provision of coaching for competitive exams is there only for aspirants.

- Lectures/workshops on Resume writing, Interview skills, Personality development and Personal grooming were organised for the overall development of the students.

Since the management is unable to pay full UGC scale to its temporary employees, it is not able to retain the experienced faculty.

Threats:

- Due to mushrooming of colleges and private universities in the area, fresh admission has become a threat now.
- Local reputed Government College charges much less fee as compared to us. The huge difference between the fee structure of private and govt. colleges is responsible for the shift of meritorious students to the Government colleges.



BEST PRACTICE:

1. Title of the Practice: SAVE ENVIRONMENT

Goal: Pollution is becoming a very serious problem these days because of the increasing use of power driven gadgets resulting into excessive emission of carbon and other effluents in the environment. This is a problem not only for an individual but for the society and world as whole with a view to check this problem, the college has taken the following initiatives:

- To popularise the use of cycle by the students.
- To popularise the pooling of travel for the students coming from far off places and this practice was extended to staff members also.
- No Vehicle day once in a month.

The prime objectives of these practices are manifold namely health fitness, saving of money, saving of fuel, protection of environment and reduced number of accidents.

The Context: It is difficult to conceive and implement such a practice because of the increase exposure of every one to wider view of the world. People have an access to all types of information and inflow of money in hands of sizeable section of the society which has resulted into increased purchasing power. Also the easy finance from banks and other agencies has also added to the purchasing power whereby increasing the purchase of scooters, motorcycles, cars and luxury items. The exposure to electronic media has drastically changed the lifestyle of the people. Everybody is shifting to the comfort zone due to which the environmental problems are cropping up. Therefore, it becomes our prime concern to address to these problems and these practices are certainly a step in this direction.

The Practice: The College has started with the practice to popularize the use of cycle instead of petrol driven vehicles among the students. This novel idea of the college has been taken positive by the majority of the students and their parents as well and it is clear from the increase in the number of students using cycles. This practice is yielding manifold benefits namely, health benefits to the students, saving of petrol, check on pollution and thereby providing a cleaner environment and reduced chances of accidents.

The students coming from far off places are motivated to aware the transport facilities of the college/public transport, pool their travel if they are to use their personal conveyance. The same practice is applicable to the staff members also. This practice is leading to a reduced emission of poisonous gases in the environment.

'No Vehicle Day' is also observed every month by the students and the staff as well which will also result in clean environment.

Though this practice is well conceived and implemented but there is a lot of hesitation among the students to follow this practice. Easy money with the parents and affluent socio-economic status becomes a discouraging factor in popularization. Moreover, students also consider it as wastage of time as it takes longer time when they use cycle. Therefore, their lifestyles and social status becomes a hindrance in accepting this practice. Keeping in mind all these factors the college is trying to educate and counsel the students in common assembly held for students and also in Tutorial Group Meeting and Parent Teacher Meeting for popularizing this practice.

Evidence of Success: The practice has proved to be successful with the increasing number of students shifting to cycles in place of petrol driven vehicles. The students are being educated to manage their time properly and save time from other activities.

A good number of students and a few staff members are availing the transport facilities of the college. Students coming from far off places are also using public transport in place of their own conveyance. Pooling of travel is prevalent among the students and staff members as well.

This scheme is being reviewed from time to time and it is expected to give good results in future.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: The practice does not require any human or non-human resources rather it saves a lot of space in the parking area. The only problem is to motivate students and change their mindset so that they shift from petrol driven vehicle to cycle. Keeping in mind the positive response from those who have adopted this scheme, the college is response from those who have adopted this scheme, the college is encouraged to take further steps to popularize this practice and extend it to more and more students by giving them additional incentives.

BEST PRACTICE

2. Title of the practice-DAILY PRAYER AND FORTNIGHTLY ASSEMBLY

Goal:- Our college has the best and healthy practice of incorporating the value education to the students with imparting knowledge. Our objective is to instill good manners, values, ethics and responsibilities among students, thereby creating responsible citizen. It is a powerful way to affect and motivate both staff and student. 




